9) DELEGATIONS/PRESENTATIONS:

a) <u>Brenda Millard – North Dundas Food Bank Re-location:</u>

Brenda Millard and Donald Johnston asked Council to consider two possible locations for further discussion; the former ambulance building on May Street in Winchester or a new structure adjacent to Gypsy Lane. Council agreed to consider a detailed presentation on the May Street location. Mayor Runnalls will advise Mrs. Millard in writing of this decision.

b) Winchester & District Lions Club – 100 Club Park Pavilion:

Members of the Winchester & District Lions Club advised Council they wish to construct a 40X60 pavilion in the Winchester 100 Club Park. In recognition of their 40 years of community service, they would like the pavilion to be named after the Winchester & District Lions Club. The Lions offered a donation of \$40,000.00 towards completion of the project. Council agreed to consider the proposal.

13) NEW BUSINESS:

RES#11-Sept/25

a) myCommunity – Municipal Agreement:

Moved by Estella Rose seconded by Eric Duncan that Council agree to enter into an agreement with *myCommunity* Neighbours Indeed at the cost of \$1,484.00 including GST.

14) OLD BUSINESS:

a) Raisin- South Nation Source Water Protection Committee:

Due to the fact Mayor Runnalls will now serve on the South Nation Board of Directors, Council may nominate another individual to act as our municipal representative. The Clerk was asked to conduct a telephone poll on Friday to receive candidate names. Deputy Mayor Rose put forward the name of Karen Switzer-Howes and Mayor Runnalls recommended, CAO, Howard Smith.

RES#12-Sept/25

b) Forward Road:

Moved by Eric Duncan and seconded by Al Armstrong that WHEREAS during the 2007 North Dundas Road Maintenance Schedule, construction and maintenance to the Forward Road was to include the removal of the old, worn down asphalt and the installation of surface treatment;

WHEREAS the repairs were completed in response to the gradually declining condition of the ageing asphalt; many potholes and ruts had developed on the road and ratepayers were consistently complaining about damage to vehicles and property;

WHEREAS in order to efficiently use taxpayers money, the road was redone with surface treatment with three main reasons as justification:

FIRST, the cost of replacing the road with new asphalt would come at a cost of nearly four times to that of surface treatment;

SECONDLY, the traffic on Forward Road was estimated at approximately 95 vehicles per day; as a result, our North Dundas Road Management Study (December 2003) recommended that the surface type for traffic between 0-200 vehicles per day be completed in gravel; however, at the discretion of Township staff, the surface type was upgraded to surface treatment for the residents on the road:

THIRDLY, in an increasing difficult financial situation, Council and staff did not believe that it would be fiscally responsible nor fair to other residents to put new asphalt on Forward Road when there are many gravel roads in the municipality

that have similar or higher traffic levels, and are in a lower surface type category and in poorer condition.

HOWEVER, after reviewing policies, tradition, and the principles of the decision, the Council of North Dundas has further examined the issues in regards to the portion of South Street West (Forward Road), all of which are within the Village of Chesterville limits according to the SD&G County Official Plan.

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Council of North Dundas, an unintentional error was made in regards to the surface type of the South Street West portion of the Forward Road. While the surface treatment was completed on that portion to show fiscal responsibility, it was not done in consistency with township policy and traditional practices.

FURTHERMORE, as reasoning for installing asphalt on that portion of Forward Road, two main points and principles should be noted;

FIRST, the unwritten policy and tradition that all roads within village limits be done in asphalt applies in this situation; the South Street West portion of the Forward Road is within the village limits.

SECONDLY, that the North Dundas Road Management Study "recommend(s) asphalt over surface treatment where:...there is closely spaced residential that is setback less than 30m from the road, e.g. villages and rural estate subdivisions." Since the subdivision owned by Erik Thompson does fall within the 30m requirement, the South Street West portion should therefore be entitled to asphalt to its current entrance and its' second entrance to be constructed.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the Township of North Dundas include the installation of asphalt from County Road 43 west to the Village of Chesterville limit in the 2008 road maintenance schedule to correct the unintentional error.

FURTHERMORE, that a copy of this resolution be sent to the residents of Forward Road and the subdivision on South Street West to communicate Council's decision and update them on the status of the situation.
