Subject:	Recreation Report

1) Winchester Centennial Pool:

Staff have been working hard to ensure the completion of this project on schedule, but we have experienced some delays by the contractor, Superior Pool. We are still targeting to have the pool open on June 17th. If that is not possible, we can either postpone the first session of swimming lessons for a week, or there are some spaces available at the Chesterville pool for the same session.

2) Chesterville Pool:

The Chesterville pool is ready to open June 8th. It will be open June 8th and 9th in conjunction with the Festival of Art on the Waterfront and then again the following weekend. Swimming lessons start June 17th and regular pool hours begin July 1st.

3) Chesterville Arena Upgrades:

The dasher board component of the project has been awarded to try to ensure they are available on schedule. The rink piping has also been ordered. The tender for the general contractor was issued on June 4th. Five general contractors attended the mandatory site meeting on June 6th and tenders are due at 2pm on June 18th. In order to stay on schedule, we need to award the contract the next day.

4) Thompson Subdivision Park:

We are getting two picnic tables and garbage cans to be added to the park.

5) Community Funding Grants:

Four applications for funding were received. The review committee met on May 30th to review the applications. The committee recommends approving \$400 grants for two of the applications; Canada Day Celebration and the Festival of Art on the Waterfront. The other applications will be reviewed again in the fall along with any new applications that come forward.

6) Recreation Facilities Operator position:

One of our operators went on LTD in the fall of 2010. We have been filling this position on a contract basis for the last two years. The employee is not anticipated to return to work in the foreseeable future, so we would like to fill this position on a full time basis. The position will be advertised as per the Recruitment and Selection policy.

7) Recreation Summer Student positions:

One of our park labourers declined our job offer, so we have offered the position to another candidate. We also interviewed and hired a student for the Special Events Coordinator position. The candidates and the pay scale are listed on the attachment for Council approval.
