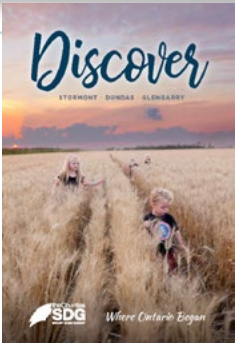
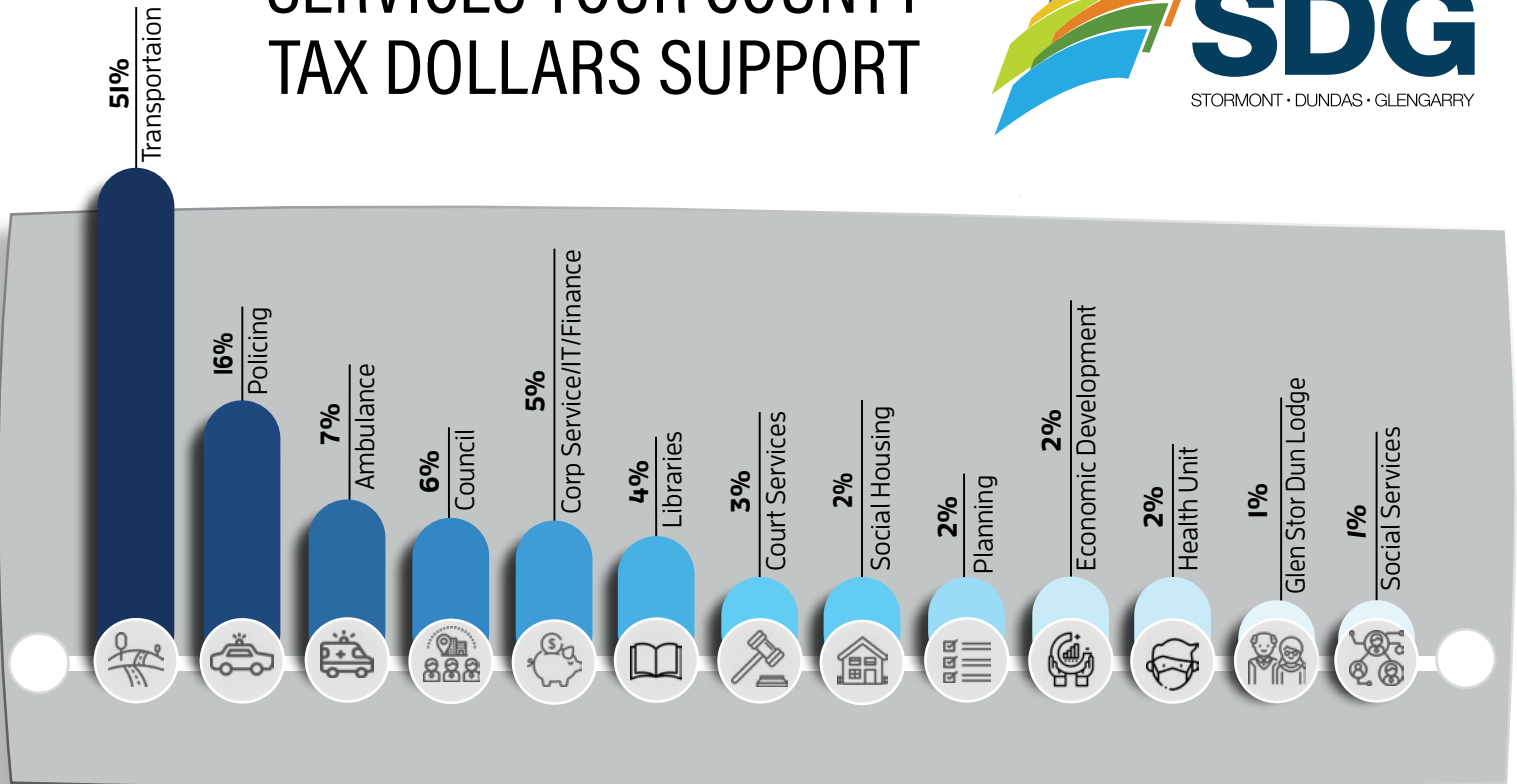

The SDG Discover guide is being printed and will be delivered this spring. This will be an uplifting marketing tool post-COVID-19. The 2020 SDG Discover Guide features rich editorial content and drives the reader to the new tourism website. The updated regional tourism website whereontariobegan.ca, will launch soon as well. This fresh new site will be easy to navigate for users and meet all their needs for planning a visit to SDG.

 Your SDG Library offers incredible online access to ebooks, eMagazines, eNewspapers, Lynda.com, ArtistWorks, and much more from the comfort of your home. A new catalogue system now makes it even easier to organize your searches and borrowed materials.

 The County will invest \$11.4 million in road resurfacing in 2020. \$4.6 million is allotted for bridge repair work and a little more than \$1.2 million is being invested in culvert and drainage infrastructure.

 Maxville Manor will receive \$2.5 million in funding to help with its plan to add 38 long-term care beds, bringing the total to 160, while also meeting new provincial government guidelines. Dundas Manor will receive \$4 million to help facilitate the construction of a new building that will complement and alleviate space concerns in the existing facility.

 The Stay Discover Grow Regional Incentives Program was created in 2018 by the County to provide financial incentives to local businesses and non-profits to develop projects that create jobs, increase assessment, and grow our economy. County Council has agreed to continue the program in 2020 despite the coronavirus pandemic to ensure we create a solid foundation for business growth. Businesses and non-profits can apply for grants that cover eligible costs up to \$50,000 per property, per year.

 SDG is policed under a single contract with the OPP—a regional approach that provides consistent service at a cost-effective price.

Warden's Message

2020 is a challenging year, physically, emotionally and financially. Prior to the coronavirus pandemic, County Council approved a responsible budget that speaks to our commitment to our seniors while also providing value to ratepayers in SDG. County Council is focused on making sound fiscal decisions that lay a solid foundation for economic growth. The work being undertaken at Maxville Manor and Dundas Manor is necessary and important to the long-term care of some of our most valued citizens. As a council we are aware of external pressures in this difficult time, and we remain committed to administering the County budget in a prudent, responsible and cost-effective manner.
